ses or cattle, which shall not be removed by the proprietor or proprietors of them, on or before the 15th day of November next, are hereby declared to be public nuisances, and may be removed as such, and the owner or owners of them, or any of them, shall be liable to the penalty of fifty cents for every day such trough, or other vessel, shall be suffered to remain in the street after notice has been given to the owner thereof, by the superintendent of police, to remove the same.

SECT. 6. *And be it further ordained and enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the 15th day of November next, if any person or persons shall make any bonfires, or burn shavings, or other combustibles, in any of the streets, lanes or alleys, of the regulated parts within the limits aforesaid, without having first obtained permission from the President of the board of commissioners, every such person, or persons shall pay a fine of four dollars.

Bonfires fined, if without leave.

SECT. 7. *And be it further ordained and enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if any black-smith, or other person shall cause any horse, mare, or gelding, to stand in any one of the streets, lanes, or alleys, within the said incorporated part of the said township, where the footway has been regulated, whilst he is shoeing, or preparing to shoe, such horse, mare, or gelding, every such black-smith, or other person, shall pay for each, and every such offence, a fine of one dollar.

Horses not to be shod, or stand on the pavement.

SECT. 8. *And be it further ordained and enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That no person or persons shall fire, or discharge any cannon, or piece of artillery, or small arms, or prove any pistol, gun, musket barrels, or cannon, or illuminate, or cause to be illuminated, any house within the regulated parts, incorporated as aforesaid, in said township, without permission from the president of the board of commissioners, under the penalty of forfeiting and paying for every piece of cannon or other artillery, or small arms, or pistol, gun, or musket barrel so fired, or house so illuminated, the sum of two dollars.

Firing guns without permission, fined.

SECT. 9. *And be it further ordained and enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if any driver, owner, or person having the ordering, or superintendence of any cart, dray, waggon, stage, or hackney coach, stage waggon, or other carriage, new or old, finished or unfinished, (other than carts or waggons coming from the country with produce,) shall suffer the same to be and remain in any street, lane

Carriages, (except country,) not to stand more than 4 hours.
