alley or room in use before the hour of 6 A. M., or after the hour 10 P. M., on any day, or shall at any time allow any boy or youth under the age of twelve years to use or play upon said alley or billiard table, or shall employ any such youth upon or about such alley or room for any purpose, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall also forfeit his license if he have one. Each day that any such alley or room shall be kept open without a license shall constitute a separate misdemeanor.

SEC. 17. Whoever shall in this city ride or drive any beast of burden in any highway, thoroughfare, or other public place, quicker than, or beyond a moderate gait, unless in a case of urgent necessity, or shall ride or drive any such animal so as to cause such animal or any vehicle attached thereto to come in collision with or strike any other object or any person, or shall leave any such animal standing in any public place without being fastened or so guarded as to prevent its running away, or shall turn any such animal loose in any thoroughfare, or shall inhumanly, unnecessarily, or cruelly beat, injure, or otherwise abuse any dumb animal, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 18. In all cases of persons meeting each other in vehicles, in any highway or thoroughfare in this city, each person so meeting shall turn off and go to the right side of such highway or thoroughfare, so as to enable such vehicles to pass each other without accident. Whoever shall violate this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 19. Whoever shall in any highway or thoroughfare in this city fly a kite, or use any sport or exercise likely to scare horses, injure passengers, or embarrass the passage of vehicles, or shall in any place within the city limits, fire any gun, pistol, or other firearm, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SEC. 20. Whoever shall in this city blast or cause to be blasted any rock, without having the rock at the time of setting off the blast covered on all sides of the orifice with good sound plank or timber of sufficient width, length and thickness, and so placed as effectually to prevent fragments of the rock from ascending into the air, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.
