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computed from the date of the service of the same by the City Marshal in case of residents, and in case of non-residents, from the date of the first publication.

SEC. 14. In constructing pavements as aforesaid, where Cellar-doors. } cellar-doors are made in the pavements, the sills of such doors shall not project above the level of the pavement; but no cellar-doors shall be made in said pavements, and no house, or house front, or portico, or steps, shall project into, on or over a pavement, without the special consent of the Board of Aldermen, under penalty of ten dollars per day while the same continues.

SEC. 15. It shall be the duty of the City Marshal to City Marshal to report violations. report any and every violation or neglect of any of the provisions of this ordinance to the City Recorder, who thereupon shall cause the party so reported to be cited before him, and upon proof that due notice, as required by this ordinance, has been given, he shall fine the delinquent not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars; and the said fine shall be imposed each and every time the delinquent shall be reported to the Recorder.

PISTOLS AND GUNS.

Be it ordained by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Memphis, as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fire any pistol, gun or other firearm within the limits of this Kites and balloons. city, unless it be on the occasion of a military parade, and then only by the order of an officer of a military company. Nor shall any person raise a kite or other like paper, or balloon, in the limits of the city. Any person violating any of the terms and provisions of this ordinance shall be fined by the Recorder not less than Penalty. five nor more than fifty dollars. If the offense be committed by a slave, he shall receive such corporal punishment as shall be adjudged by the Recorder.
