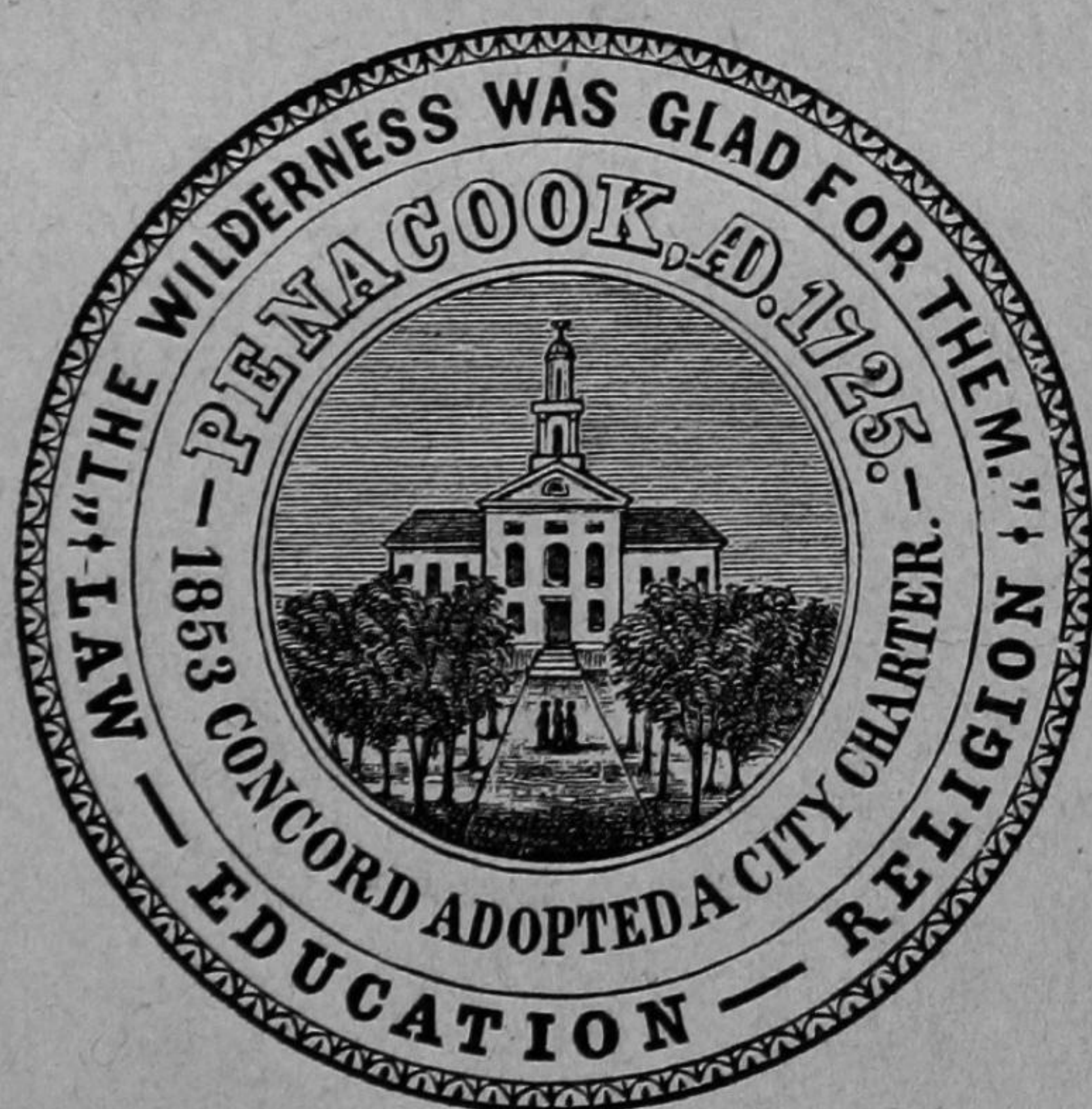

An Ordinance regulating Refreshment Saloons and Restaurants.

SECTION

1. No person to keep restaurant without license.
2. No intoxicating liquors to be kept.
3. To be closed at 10, P. M.
4. Not to be opened on Sunday.

SECTION

5. License to be revoked on violation.
6. Duty of police officers.
7. Penalty for violation.
8. Ordinances repealed.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Concord as follows :

SECTION 1. No person shall keep a refreshment saloon or restaurant within the city of Concord until a license for that purpose shall have been obtained of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen.

SEC. 2. No intoxicating liquors shall be used or kept in any refreshment saloon or restaurant within the city for any purpose whatever.

SEC. 3. Every refreshment saloon or restaurant shall be cleared of company, and closed at ten o'clock on each evening, and not re-opened till five o'clock the following morning.

SEC. 4. No person shall keep open any restaurant, or any place used as a restaurant within the city, on Sunday, or make any sale within such restaurant or place, or permit any person to remain within the same on said day.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen to revoke any license by them granted, on satisfactory evidence of the violation of any of the provisions herein contained.

SEC. 6. It shall be the duty of police officers and watchmen to arrest any and every person whom they may find violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, and to cause suitable complaint against any and every person so offending to be made to the Police Court.

SEC. 7. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of not less than five, nor more than ten dollars.

SEC. 8. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed.
