AN ORDINANCE relating to Misdemeanors.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Leavenworth:

Penal offenses.

SEC. 1. That the several acts and offenses specified in this ordinance, are hereby prohibited in this city, and any person found guilty of any or either of them, shall be subject to the penalties herein provided for them respectively.

Disturbing peace, &c.

SEC. 2. For disturbing the quiet of the city, or of any lawful assembly of persons, or of any neighborhood, or family, or person or persons, for indecent or obscene language or conduct, for any assault, battery, or affray, a sum not less than one, nor more than one hundred dollars.

Penalty.

Throwing stones, &c.

SEC. 3. For throwing stones, bricks, or other hard substances, in or across any street or alley of this city, or within any public place, or at any house, or building, or boat, or vessel, a fine not less than three, nor more than fifteen dollars.

Penalty.

Discharging fire-arms, &c.

SEC. 4. For discharging any fire-arms, setting off fire-crackers or squibs, throwing any fire-ball or other combustible substance, or making bonfires within the limits of the city, a fine not less than three, nor more than twenty-five dollars; *Provided*, that this section shall not apply nor be in force on the first day of January, of the fourth day of July of each year, and provided farther, that this section may be suspended on other days by the mayor; neither shall this section apply to persons authorized to keep a pistol gallery, nor to any gunsmith who may carefully discharge fire-arms in the prosecution of his trade, nor shall it apply to the shooting of dogs running at large in violation of the city ordinances.

Penalty.

Proviso.

False alarm of fire.
Lighting cigar, &c., in stables, &c.

SEC. 5. For knowingly causing any false alarm of fire, or for lighting a cigar, pipe, or match, in any barn, stable, or other building, containing hay, straw, or other combustible material, a fine not less than ten dollars.

Drunkenness.

Penalty.

SEC. 6. For being found intoxicated in any street, alley, or other public place in this city, for the first offense, not more than ten dollars; and for each subsequent offense, not less than five dollars.
