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his deputies, to arrest any person carrying such concealed weapons.

SEC. 3. Peace officers shall be exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance, as regards to the carrying of such fire-arms or weapons.

SEC. 4. Any person violating section 1 of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and, on conviction before the Recorder, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten (10) dollars nor more than one hundred (100) dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than five (5) days nor more than twenty (20) days, at the discretion of the Recorder.

CONCERNING OFFENCES AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT.

[No. 475—Approved March 6, 1868.]

The City of Portland does ordain as follows :

SECTION 1. That any person or persons who shall be guilty of any violent, riotous or disorderly conduct, or who shall use any profane, abusive or obscene language in any street, house or place, whereby the peace or quiet of the city is or may be disturbed, or who shall be guilty of any indecent or immoral act or practice, shall, on conviction thereof before the Recorder, be subject to a penalty of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. That any person or persons who shall fire any pistol, gun or rifle, or any other species of fire-arms within

the following limits: the Willamette river on the east and (10) Tenth Street on the west, Caruther's Addition on the south, and F Street in Couch's Addition on the north, shall, on conviction thereof before the Recorder, be subject to a penalty of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment, at the discretion of the Recorder, not exceeding twenty days. *Provided*, That the Marshal may permit upon the national holidays and other days of public celebration, any appropriate display of fire-arms and other instruments named in this section.

SEC. 3. That any person or persons who shall be guilty of any assault, or assault and battery, within the corporate limits of the city, shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment at the discretion of the Recorder, not exceeding twenty days.

SEC. 4. Any person or persons who shall draw any species of fire-arms, or any dirk, dagger or knife, or other deadly weapon upon the person of another, within the limits of the City of Portland, shall, on conviction thereof before the Recorder, be fined not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, and may be imprisoned for any period not exceeding twenty days.

SEC. 5. Any person or persons who shall resist any peace officer, or who shall refuse to assist him in the discharge of his duties, or who shall by any means whatever aid or assist any person in custody upon charge of the violation of the city Ordinance, in his endeavor to escape from such custody, whether such escape be effected or not, shall, on conviction,
