

there make complaint on oath as to the guilt of said person or persons under arrest; and for such services said constable or police shall be entitled, in addition to constable fees (mileage excepted) to the sum of two dollars per day for every days actual service between the fifth and the fifteenth days of September, for which time he may be appointed: *provided*, said constable shall make an affidavit to the actual amount of service performed, and file the same with the clerk of the county board of supervisors on or before the first day of November next following.

§ 50. The county board of supervisors are hereby authorized to audit the accounts of said constables or police appointed under the provisions of this act, in the same manner and at the same time that other county officers' accounts are audited.

§ 51. Justices of the peace shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine all cases arising under the provisions of this act, and to order said constables to collect any fines levied, and sell any and all berries by him seized under the provisions of this act, and to make due returns thereof, and to pay over to said justice all fines, together with the proceeds of all sales; and the said justice, after deducting his own fees, shall pay over the balance into the county treasury on or before the first day of November next following.

MISCELLANEOUS.

§ 52. Every person removing ice, or causing it to be removed from any stream, pond or lake, who shall neglect to place around the margin of the opening made by such removal, such fences of brush or boards or other material as may be sufficient to warn passengers of the existence and boundaries of such opening, are hereby declared guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than twenty nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty days nor more than six months.

§ 53. Any person or persons in this State who shall hereafter set any gun, pistol or revolver, or any other firearms, for the purpose of killing deer or any other game, or for any other purpose, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, and shall be imprisoned in the county jail of the proper county for a term of not less than twenty days.
