CHAPTER LXIX.

OF SNOW ON SIDE-WALKS.

1. Snow to be cleaned from side-walks; penalty.

1. The tenant or occupant, and, in case there shall be no tenant, the owner, or any person having the care of any building or lot of land bordering on any street, lane or public place within the town, where there is any paved foot-way or side-walk, shall, after the ceasing to fall of any snow, if in the day time, within two hours, and if in the night time, before ten o'clock in the forenoon succeeding, cause the same to be removed therefrom: and in default thereof shall pay a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars.

CHAPTER LXX.

OF DISCHARGING FIRE-ARMS OR ARROWS FROM A BOW OR CROSS-BOW IN STREETS, PLAYING BANDY, THROWING SNOW BALLS, STONES, ETC.

1. Discharging fire-arms; arrows from a bow; playing bandy; throwing snow balls or stones; penalty.

1. If any person, in any street or public alley, shall fire or discharge any gun, pistol or other fire-arms, or play bandy, or throw snow balls, stones or other missiles, or discharge arrows from a bow or cross-bow, he shall be fined not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars.

CHAPTER LXXI.

OF GUTTERS AND SEWERS.

1. Gutters and drains to be kept open; penalty.
2. Obstructions in culverts, gutters and sewers; penalty,

3. Sewer sinks to be kept in good condition; penalty.

1. Every person occupying a house or lot shall, as far as such lot extends, cause the paved gutter or drain, in a street or alley opposite thereto, to be constantly kept open and free from obstructions; and if he fails to do so may be fined not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars; and for each day after the first that such obstructions remain shall
