SECT. 2. If any damage shall be sustained by any persons by the discontinuing of any public or private way the Joint Standing Committee on laying out new streets and assessing damages therefor, when so required, shall report to the City Council what compensation they should receive, and also whether the damage is occasioned by the discontinuance of a public or private way.

SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of said committee to graduate the public streets whenever specially directed by the City Council, and for that purpose, when needed, may employ at the expense of the City, suitable surveyors to aid them in that service; and they shall from time to time report their doings in writing to the City Council, accompanied by such drawings or plans as may be necessary to explain the same. And if such report shall be accepted, and the graduation adopted by the City Council, the making or repairing of said streets shall be done in conformity with such graduation.

NUMBER XVIII.

An Ordinance to prevent damage by dogs.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Gardiner, as follows:

Every dog owned or kept in the city, shall constantly wear a collar round its neck, with the name of its owner or keeper legibly engraved thereon, and the owner or keeper of such dog found without such collar, shall forfeit two dollars, and the dog may be killed by any person whenever so directed by the Mayor or City Marshal.

NUMBER XIX.

An Ordinance providing for the safe keeping of gunpowder.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Gardiner, as follows;

SEC. 1. The Mayor and Aldermen shall appoint one or more depositories, at a proper distance from occupied buildings, for the safe keeping of gunpowder.

SEC. 2. No person not licensed to keep and sell gunpowder, shall keep, or have in his store, shop, dwelling-house or other tenement, at any time, a larger quantity of gunpowder than one pound, unless specially authorized by the Mayor or one of the Aldermen.

SEC. 3. No person licensed to keep and sell gunpowder, shall have, or keep in his store, or any other building or place, except the gunpowder depository appointed by the Mayor and Aldermen, more than twenty-five pounds of gunpowder at any one time; and that in a safe and secure tin or copper vessel, and in a situation where it can be readily removed in case of fire.

SEC. 4. No person shall haul unto, or lay at any wharf in the city, any vessel having on board more than twenty-five pounds of gun-powder, nor discharge or receive on board exceeding that quantity, without having first obtained from the Mayor a permit therefor, designating the wharf at which said powder may be landed or received on board.

SEC. 5. The Mayor and Aldermen, or either of them, shall have authority, and it is hereby made their duty, to enter any building or other place in the city to search for gunpowder supposed to be concealed there contrary to law, having first obtained a search warrant for the purpose, as the law requires.

NUMBER XX.

An Ordinance to secure the due regulation of bowling alleys.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Gardiner, as follows:

If any person owning or having the care or control of any bowling alley, shall allow or permit the same to be kept open or used, except between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and eight in the evening on any week day, except Saturday, and on that day between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the afternoon, or shall suffer or permit any intoxicating drinks to be drank in or about the same, or allow or permit any minor to be admitted to such alley or play at bowls therein without the
