SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 52.

Amendment to Section 3 of Ordinance No. 11.

The People of the Town of Jacksonville do Ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 3d of Ordinance No. 11 be amended so as to read as follows:

SEC. 3. Any person wishing to keep a billiard table or tables, for public use, shall pay into the Town Treasury the sum of twenty dollars per annum, in coin, for each table, and at the same rate for a shorter period: *Provided*, That no license shall be granted for a shorter period than six months: and upon the applicant producing to the Recorder the receipt for the required sum, and upon paying one dollar and fifty cents for Recorder's fees, that officer shall issue said applicant a license to keep such billiard table or tables for the term to which his receipt shall entitle him.

SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 53.

For the Better Protection of the Cemetery.

The People of the Town of Jacksonville do Ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That the public Cemetery ground shall be under charge of the Sexton of the Town, who shall have the power to regulate all matters of interment within said Cemetery, and to preserve and keep from any injury all the fences, gates, grave-boards, palings and tomb-stones; and all graves shall be dug by or under the direction of the Sexton, and to whom only applications must be made therefor.

SEC. 2. No person shall deface or injure in any manner, remove or displace any palings or enclosures for graves, or tomb-stones, headboards or stakes as designating graves, or stakes set for lines of any alley on said grounds; nor shall injure any shrubbery, flowers, trees or plants that may be placed within the Cemetery grounds, or which may be naturally growing therein.

SEC. 9. All persons are forbidden to shoot or fire off

any gun within said Cemetery enclosure, or to put or turn loose any animal therein.

SEC. 4. All graves shall be placed or dug according to the direction of the Sexton, and no person shall be allowed to dig any grave, or attempt to inter any dead therein, without the permission and by the direction of the said Sexton.

SEC. 5. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable, on complaint being made to the Town Recorder, to a fine of not more than \$50 nor less than \$5 and costs.

SEC. 6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 54.

To Establish the Initial Point and Base Line for Town Surveys.

The People of the Town of Jacksonville do Ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That the following-described line be, and is hereby, established as a base line, and the points in said line hereinafter mentioned and described be, and are hereby, established as initial points for all surveys and measurements for said Town, to-wit: Commencing at a point for the intersection of the center line of California and Oregon streets, marked and indicated by the center of a hole drilled through a sandstone, 24 by 22 by 12 inches, set in the street; thence running S., $67\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., along the center line of California street 262 feet, to a point for the intersection of the center of California and Third streets, marked and designated by a bar of round iron 20 inches long and $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter, set in the street; thence in the same direction along the center of California street 262 feet, to a point for the intersection of the center of California and Fourth streets, marked and designated by a bar of round iron 20 inches long and $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, set in the street; thence in the same direction along the center of California street 262 feet to a point for the intersection of the center of California and Fifth streets, marked and designated by the center of a hole drilled in [and] through a sandstone 20 by 18 by 14 inches, set in the street.

SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
