IMPROPER USE OF STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES.

SEC. 30. No person shall throw, deposit or place in or upon any public street, sidewalk or alley in Boise City, and rubbish, garbage, filth, shavings, straw, paper, hay, packing boxes, waste fragments or other combustible substance or material; and every owner, lessee, tenant, or occupant of any house, tenement, lot or premises in Boise City who shall suffer any such rubbish, garbage, filth, shavings, straw, paper, hay, packing boxes, waste fragments or other combustible substance or material to remain upon or in any street, sidewalks, or alley, adjacent to the premises owned or occupied by him, for twenty-four hours after notice from the city marshal, watchman, or fire warden to remove the same, shall be deemed guilty of a public nuisance and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars or imprisoned not exceeding five days, or punished by both such fine and imprisonment, and the expense of removing any such nuisance may be recovered from him in a civil action.

STORING OF POWDER.

SEC. 31. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, corporation or association to keep or store in any building, store or warehouse, within the corporate limits of Boise City any gunpowder or blasting powder in greater quantities than fifty pounds; or for any person, firm, association or corporation to keep within the corporate limits of Boise City any giant powder, nitro-glycerine, gun cotton, Herculese powder, dynamite or other material or substance of equal explosive force by whatever name known.

PENALTY.

SEC. 32. Any person or persons violating the provisions of section 31 of this chapter shall on conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not less than twenty-five nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than ten nor more than twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, together with costs of prosecution.
