house or other building, or upon any wooden floor, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 446. Any person who carries any burning coal, brand, lighted cigar or pipe, into any warehouse or other building in which cotton or any other inflammable material is stored, compressed or ginned, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 447. Any person who puts or keeps, or causes to be put or kept, any hay, straw, fodder or shucks in any stack or pile without having the same enclosed or secured so as to be protected from sparks of fire, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 448. Any person who keeps or stores in any building within the fire limits of the city, (except a licensed warehouse) more than twenty bales of hay, fodder or shucks, at one time, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 449. Any person who fires or discharges, or causes to be fired or discharged, any pistol, gun, cannon, anvil, or anything of like kind or character; or who lets off or discharges any rocket, fire-crackers, squib or other fire-works, without first having obtained permission of the Mayor, who shall designate the place where such firing may be done, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 450. Any person who burns or causes to be burned, any trash, shavings, straw or other combustible or inflammable substance in any street or yard, unless it be done in the day time and at least twenty feet from any building or lumber or woodyard, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 451. Any person who carries or causes to be carried, any powder upon any vehicle, without having the same so arranged as effectually to cover up the packages or kegs, and guard them from public view and from accident from fire, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 452. Any person who receives or delivers any powder or matches concealed in any manner and purporting to be any other article or commodity, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 453. Any person who flies a kite without the express permission from the Mayor; or who in any manner impedes the safe and free passage of persons or vehicles along the streets, must, on conviction, be fined not less than one nor more than one hundred dollars.
