CONCERNING OFFENSES AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT.

No. 2356—Approved January 17, 1879.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That any person or persons who shall be guilty of any violent, riotous or disorderly conduct, or who shall use any profane, abusive or obscene language in any street, house or place, whereby the peace or quiet of the city is or may be disturbed, or who shall be guilty of any indecent or immoral act or practice, shall, on conviction thereof before the Police Court, be subject to a penalty of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment in the city jail not less than five nor more than twenty days, or both, at the discretion of the court.

SEC. 2. That any person or persons who shall fire any pistol, gun or rifle, or any other species of fire-arms, within the corporate limits of the city, shall, on conviction thereof before the Police Court, be fined not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars: *Provided,* That all circumstances of necessity may be plead as a defense to the offense described in this section; and, *provided further,* that the Chief of Police may permit upon the national holidays and other days of public celebration any appropriate display of firearms named in this section.

SEC. 3. That any person or persons who shall be guilty of any assault, or assault and battery, within the corporate limits of the city, shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment at the dis-
