railing during the night-time, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 16. Whoever shall discharge any cannon, gun, ^{Shooting in streets, lots &c} pistol or other fire-arms in or across any street or other public place, or in or across any private lot, tract of land or other place not his own property, without first obtaining a permit to do so from the Mayor of the city, if in a public place, or from the owner of the lot or land if in a private place, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than three nor more than thirty dollars.

SEC. 17. Whoever shall wilfully make, or cause to be ^{Fire alarm, false} made, any false alarm of fire, or any call of night watch shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars.

SEC. 19. Whoever shall wilfully cut, hack or other- ^{Injuring trees, fences, bridges, buildings, &c} wise injure any lamp-post, ornamental or shade tree, railing, fence, building, bridge or other property belonging to the city, or shall wilfully cut, hack or otherwise injure any shade or ornamental tree, standing or being along any side-walk, whether placed there by the city or by the adjacent lot owner, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 20. Whoever shall ride, lead or drive any horse or ^{Driving across side-walk} mule across or along any side-walk, or shall drive or back any horse, mule, oxen or team of horses, mules or oxen attached to any vehicle across or along any side-walk, or shall injure or destroy any side-walk not his own property, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction
