

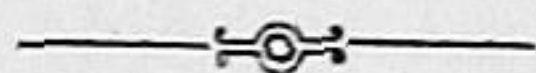

such by the inhabitants of the City of Olympia, living in the vicinity of such house, or by the police officers of said city.

SEC. 4. It shall be prima facie proof, under this ordinance, that the person charged visited a house of ill-fame for lewd or improper purposes, to prove that he was in such house without any lawful business therein.

ORDINANCE No. 152.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO OFFENSES AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT.

SECTION 1. *Be it ordained by the City of Olympia:* That any person who shall be guilty of drunkenness or other disorderly or riotous conduct in any street, road, lane or alley, or any public place or building, or keep a disorderly house within the City of Olympia, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in the court of the Committing Magistrate, be fined in any sum not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not less than five nor more than fifty days, or both at the discretion of the court.

SEC. 2. That any person who shall draw, exhibit or attempt to use any deadly weapon within the corporate limits of the City of Olympia, upon, to or against another person, shall be liable to a fine of not more than fifty nor less than twenty-five dollars.

SEC. 3. Any person who shall, in the usual walks of life, within the limits of the City of Olympia, carry any deadly weapon concealed about his person, shall be liable to fine of not more than ten nor less than five dollars.

SEC. 4. Any person who shall, within the following limits, to wit: between Union street on the south-east corner of Cherry; thence north, on a line, to First street; thence west to the western shore of Budd's Inlet; thence south to the line of Union street, continued; fire off or discharge any gun, pistol or firearm of any kind, shall be liable to a fine of not less than five nor more than twenty dollars, or by imprisonment for not less than five nor more than ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. [Amended: see ordinance No 176.]

SEC. 5. That any person or persons who shall fire or explode any fire-crackers, bombs, torpedoes or any other explosive, within the City of Olympia, without first obtaining permission from the City Council, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment for not less than one, nor more than ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; *Provided*, that this Section shall not apply to persons using fireworks on the public square, the Swantown and Marshville bridges, and all boats or crafts upon the waters of the sound within the corporate limits of the City.

SEC. 6. Any person or persons who shall resist any peace officer, or who shall refuse to assist him in the discharge of his duties, or who shall by any means whatever, aid or assist any person in custody upon the charge of a violation of a city ordinance, in his endeavors to escape from such custody, whether such escape be effected or not, shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than ten nor more than twenty-five dollars, or shall be imprisoned not less than ten nor more than twenty-five days, or both, at the discretion of the court.

SEC. 7. No person or persons shall ride or drive any horse or horses, mule or mules, or any beast of burden, within the corporate limits of the city, at a greater speed than six miles per hour; and any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this section, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than five nor more than fifty dollars.

SEC. 8. That if any person or persons shall wilfully ride or drive any horse or other animal over any bridge within the corporate limits of the City of Olympia, at any gait faster than a walk, the said person or persons so offending, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in a sum of not less than five nor more than ten dollars.

SEC. 9. That if any person or persons shall ride, drive or lead any horse upon any sidewalk within the corporate limits of the City of Olympia, he or they shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars for each and every offense.

SEC. 10. That any person or persons who shall remove any soil, ground or sand from any street bordering upon, or running to Budd's Inlet, on any part of the waters within the corporate limits of the City of Olympia, unless by special permission from the City Council, given in writing, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be

fined in any sum not exceeding five dollars for each and every such offense, together with the costs of prosecution.

SEC. 11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with, or relating to the subject matter of this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

SEC. 12. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

ORDINANCE No. 232.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE APPROVED AUGUST 16TH, 1878, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE OLYMPIA WATER COMPANY THE RIGHT OF SUPPLYING THE TOWN OF OLYMPIA WITH FRESH WATER, AND TO LAY DOWN PIPE," NUMBERED 135.

SECTION 1. *The City of Olympia does ordain as follows:* That Section 2, of ordinance No. 135, entitled "An ordinance granting to the Olympia Water Company the right of supplying the Town of Olympia with fresh water, and to lay down pipe," approved August 16th, 1878, be, and the same is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows: "Sec. 2. Said corporation is authorized to lay down pipes in said Town, and through and along all the streets and alleys thereof; to make the necessary excavations for the laying, repairing and replacement of said pipes, but shall not be allowed to unnecessarily obstruct such streets or alleys, or for a longer time than is absolutely necessary to make such improvement; and all the privileges and franchises granted by this ordinance, are granted to said Olympia Water Company and its successors and assigns, and the said Olympia Water Company may mortgage, assign or otherwise dispose of said privileges and franchises to the same extent and in the same manner as it is authorized by law to dispose of its other property."

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
