CHAPTER 67.

Public Peace—Amendment.

AN ACT to amend section one of an act entitled "An Act to preserve the public peace by preventing the display of knives and other deadly weapons in the presence of one or more persons," approved March 4, 1882.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wyoming:

SECTION 1. That section one of an act entitled "An Act to preserve the public peace by preventing the display of knives and other deadly weapons in the presence of one or more persons," approved March 4, 1882, the same being chapter 81, of the Session Laws of 1882, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Display of
deadly weapons
misdemeanor.

Penalty.

In force.

Section 1. Whoever shall, in the presence of one or more persons, exhibit any kind of fire-arms, bowie-knife, dirk, dagger, slung-shot, or other deadly weapon, in a rude, angry or threatening manner not necessary to the defense of his person, family or property, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 68.

Relief Act, Repeal of.

AN ACT to repeal an act entitled "An Act to aid the county commissioners of Sweetwater county to settle with W. A. Johnson."

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wyoming:
