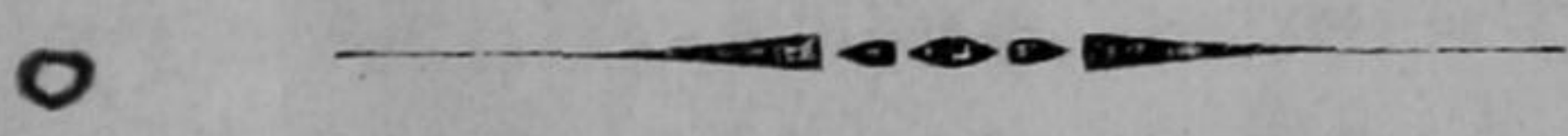

Sec. 60. Ordered, that if any person sell malt liquors, wine, or any mixtures thereof, clandestinely or unlawfully within the jurisdictional limits of the Corporation, he shall be fined \$20.00 for each offense, on conviction.

Adopted August 11th, 1884.

Sec. 61. Ordered, that any person in the Corporation carrying about his person, concealed from public view, any pistol, dirk, razor, or any like weapon or other weapons, shall be fined not exceeding \$20.00 for each offense, and the said pistol, dirk, razor or such like weapon so found, shall be confiscated by the Mayor and sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash and the proceeds turned over to the School Fund of the Corporation.

Adopted Sept. 15th, 1884.

Sec. 62. Ordered, that it shall not be lawful for any one to have milch cows or stock cattle run at large in the streets of the Corporation between sun-set and sun-rise without some one is driving them to water or pasture, or some other point under their immediate direction and control, and any person violating this ordinance, shall be fined not exceeding \$5.00 for each offense.

Adopted June 18th, 1886.

Sec. 63. Ordered, that hereafter it shall be the duty of the Sergeant of the Town of Front Royal, or any duly appointed assistant, to arrest and bring before the Mayor of the town any suspicious character, male or female, found upon the streets or in any alley or vacant or private lot (other than their owner) of this town, after eleven o'clock, P. M., and when said party is brought before the Mayor, and fails to give a satisfactory account of his or her presence on the streets or in the alleys or lots aforesaid at such a time of night, he or she shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$5 00, in the discretion of the Mayor.

Adopted Oct. 25th, 1886.

Sec. 64. Ordered, that the law heretofore passed by this Council requiring property owners, adjacent to a street where a walk or pavement of brick or stone has been made, to renew the same from time to time as needed, be and the same is made applicable alone to streets where pavements of brick or stone have once been made at the expense of the Corporation.

Adopted June 2nd, 1888.

Sec. 65. Ordered, that it shall not be lawful for any butcher or vendor of meats to slaughter his stock within the corporate limits of Front Royal, either at slaughter house, pen or rack. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of not more than \$10.00 for each such violation.

Adopted July 9th, 1888.
