## CHAPTER LXXIII.

AN ACT to amend section two hundred and twenty-nine of an act entitled "An act providing for the settlement and distribution of decedents' estates." Approved April 14, 1881, which section is numbered 2455 in the Revised Statutes of 1881.

[APPROVED APRIL 11, 1885.]

Act amended.

Decedents' estates, settlement of.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,* That section two hundred and twenty-nine of the above entitled act be amended to read as follows: Section 229. Such appeal bond shall be filed within ten days after the decision complained of is made, unless, for good cause shown, the Court to which the appeal is prayed shall direct such appeal to be granted, on the filing of such bond, within one year after such decision. But any person who is aggrieved, desiring such appeal, may take the same in his own name, without joining any other person. The transcript shall be filed in the Supreme Court within thirty days after filing the bond.

## CHAPTER LXXIV.

AN ACT to prohibit the sale of dangerous toys.

[APPROVED APRIL 11, 1885.]

Toys.

Sale of dangerous toys prohibited.

Penalty.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,* That it shall be unlawful for any firm, company or person within the State of Indiana to manufacture, sell, or expose for sale, or give away as a prize or reward, any toy pistol, or other device for the purpose of exploding caps or wafers containing fulminates or other explosive compounds, and persons so selling or offering to sell or give away such toy, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail not less than ten nor more than twenty days.
