RIDING OR DRIVING UPON SIDEWALKS.

SEC. 5. Any person who shall lead, drive or ride any horse, mule or other beast of burthen, whether hitched to a vehicle or not upon any sidewalk within the corporate limits of Boise City, shall upon conviction for each offense be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty dollars, or imprisonment in the city jail not more than ten days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

USE OF STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES.

SEC. 6. All persons are forbidden to use any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks, parks or public places in Boise City as a camping place for themselves, teams or wagons at any time, or to cause or permit any team or wagon to remain in any said places to the detriment of public travel or convenience; or to cause or permit any live stock of any description to be herded in any of said places during any hours of the day or night. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section shall, on conviction thereof before the city magistrate, be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars and costs, and each day of continuing or maintaining such violation shall be deemed a new offense, and punished accordingly.

HITCHING TO SHADE TREES AND PROTECTING THE SAME.

SEC. 7. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to hitch or fasten any animal to, or otherwise destroy or injure any growing or living shade tree or ornamental tree, or any box or case around such tree, or any lamp post, or for any person to cut, break, girdle or any way injure any shade or ornamental tree which has been planted, or may hereafter be planted, upon any of the public streets or grounds of this city, except by consent of the owner thereof.

SEC. 8. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of section seven of this chapter shall, on conviction thereof before the city magistrate, be punished by fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

USE OF AIR OR SPRING GUNS.

SEC. 9. Any person who shall carry, use for amusement

or otherwise, or have in his or her possession, within the corporate limits of Boise City, the device or weapon commonly known as an air gun or spring gun, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding ten dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail not more than five days, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment.

BUILDING BON-FIRES AND DISCHARGING EXPLOSIVES.

SEC. 10. It shall not be lawful within the fire limits of this city, for any person to build bon-fires, or fires of any description, on any public street, alley or vacant lot, nor to build bon-fires, or fires of any description on any street or alley or vacant lot without the fire limits, underneath telephone, electric light, telegraph or electric railway wires or other wires used for conveying electricity, nor shall any person build bon-fires in any part of the city without special permit from the city marshal; nor shall any person discharge cannon, anvils, bombs, giant powder or any other explosive within the fire limits; nor shall any person set off rockets or other fire works, within the fire limits, without special permit from the mayor. Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be fined in a sum not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the city jail not less than three nor more than twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

STORAGE OF HAY.

SEC. 11. It shall be, and is unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation, to keep for sale any quantity of hay, of any kind, exceeding three tons in weight of loose hay, and ten tons of baled hay, within the fire limits of Boise City.

ACCUMULATION OF LITTER OR COMBUSTIBLES.

SEC. 12. Each person making or using, or having the charge or control of shavings, hay, straw, sacks, bags, litter or any other combustible waste or fragments shall, at the close of each day, cause the same to be securely stored or disposed of so as to be safe from fire.
