cent exposure of his or her person, or be guilty of any lewd or indecent act or behavior, shall on conviction be fined not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Sec. 14. Whoever shall in any manner or by any means be guilty of cruelty to any dumb animal, or shall be guilty of turning out and abandoning any old, or decrepit or worthless animal upon the public streets of the city, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty dollars.

### DIVISION III.

#### OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC SAFETY, CONVENIENCE AND HEALTH.

Sec. 15. Whoever shall fire or discharge any cannon, gun, pistol revolver or any firearm of any description, or shall fire, or explode or set off any squib, firecracker, torpedo or other thing containing powder or other explosive material, without permission from the Mayor or common council so to do, within the city limits, shall, on conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than twenty dollars; provided that such permission, when given, shall definitely limit the time of such firing, and may at any time be revoked. But nothing in this section shall prevent the ordinary and usual fireworks demonstration on National holidays; subject, however, to such regulation, control and orders as the City Marshal may deem proper to make for the protection of property from fire.

Sec. 16. Whoever shall ride or drive any horse or horses, mule or mules, or any other animal, in any street or alley of the city, at a greater speed than six miles an hour, or who shall heedlessly drive any such animal so that such an animal or any vehicle attached thereto shall come in collision with any other vehicle, or shall strike against any person, or who shall ride or drive any horse, mule or other animal faster than a walk on or across any public wharf or bridge supported by piles or trusses, within said city, shall on conviction be fined not less than five nor more than fifty dollars.

Sec. 17. Whoever shall leave any horse, mule or other animal attached to any vehicle or conveyance, or in any unenclosed place of the city, without being securely fastened or guarded, shall be fined not less than five nor more than fifty dollars.

Sec. 18. Whoever shall by any means, either wilfully or for want of reasonable care, frighten any horse, mule or other animal being at the time attached to any vehicle or in charge of any person, shall on conviction be fined in any sum not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars.

Sec. 19. No person shall throw or deposit on any street, or sidewalk or footpath of this city, any broken glass, bottles,
