to be made by or through any district telegraph, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly.

SEC. 36. Any person who shall trespass upon the city cemetery, or any cemetery within the city, by destroying, injuring, or defacing any grave, vault, tombstone, or monument, or any building, fence, tree, shrub, flower, or anything belonging to said cemeteries, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly, and shall be liable for any and all damages done.

SEC. 37. Any person who shall sell, or keep for sale, within the city of Davenport, any toy pistol or toy gun which is discharged by means of any fulminating or explosive cap, cartridge, or other explosive substance, or which explodes any cap or cartridge containing fulminating powder or other explosive substance, and any person who shall use, discharge, or shoot off any such toy pistol or gun within said city, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly.

SEC. 38. Any person who shall place or keep in any street or alley of the city, for the purpose of feeding the same, any horse, mule, or other animal, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly.

SEC. 39. It shall be unlawful for any person to own, keep or be interested as clerk, agent, keeper, or owner, in keeping any disorderly house within the city of Davenport; any house or place where people resort for the purpose of or are permitted to play any games of chance or skill for money, property, or anything of value, directly or indirectly, or to drink intoxicating liquors of any kind, or to engage in lewd, boisterous, or other disorderly conduct, shall be held to be a disorderly house within the meaning of this section. Any person violating this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly.
