CHAPTER 341.

Passed May 14, 1896. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A HARBOR LINE IN THE TOWN OF JAMESTOWN.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

Jamestown,

SECTION 1. The town council of the town of Jamestown is hereby authorized to establish a harbor line along the easterly side of said town near the ferry as follows:

Said line shall begin at a point 500 feet easterly from the low water mark at the easterly end of Hamilton avenue, and shall extend thence, in a northwesterly direction to a point 400 feet due east from the end of the present filled portion of the wharf of the Newport and Jamestown Ferry Company, and shall extend thence, in a northeasterly direction to a point in the prolongation of the northerly line of land of S. H. Gurteen, and 500 feet distant from the intersection of the low water mark with said line, according to a plat of said line which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof; and upon the passage of a resolution by said town council, establishing said line, the same shall be the harbor line of said town of Jamestown in front of the shore adjacent thereto.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 342.

Passed May 14, 1896. AN ACT CONCERNING EXPLOSIVES USED IN FIRE CRACKERS.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

Fire crackers
containing any
explosive other
than gun-
powder not to
be sold or used.

SECTION 1. Every person who shall sell, expose for sale, or have in his possession with intent to sell, use, or explode, or shall use or explode any fire cracker containing any explosive other than gunpowder, shall be fined not more than twenty dollars.

SEC. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
