ACT XLV.

AN ACT to amend section 5132 of Sandels & Hill's Digest.

SECTION

1. Amends section 5132, Sandels & Hill's Digest, relating to powers of Boards of Health.
2. Repeals all laws in conflict, and act take effect after December 31, 1897.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas:

SECTION 1. They shall have power to prevent injury or annoyance within the limits of the corporation from anything dangerous, offensive or unhealthy, and to cause any nuisance to be abated within the jurisdiction given to the board of health in section 5203, to regulate the transportation and keeping of gun-powder, dynamite, and other combustibles, and to provide or license magazines for the same; to prevent and punish fast or immoderate riding of horses, or driving or propelling of vehicles through the streets; to establish and regulate markets; to provide for the measuring or weighing of hay, wood, or any other article for sale; to regulate the transportation of articles throughout the streets, and to prevent injury to the streets from overloaded vehicles; to prevent cruelty to animals; to prevent any riots, noise, disturbance, or disorderly assemblages; to regulate drumming or soliciting persons who arrive on trains, or otherwise, for hotels, boarding houses, bath houses or doctors; to license such drummers, and to provide that each drummer shall wear a badge plainly exposed to view, showing for whom and for what he is drumming or soliciting patronage, and to punish by fine any violation of this provision; to license, regulate, tax or suppress ordinaries, hawkers, peddlers, brokers, pawnbrokers, money changers, intelligence officers, public masquerade balls, street exhibitions, sparring exhibitions, dance houses, fortune tellers, pistol galleries, corn doctors, private lock venereal hospitals, museums and menageries, equestrian performances, haroscopic views, lung testers, muscle developers,

magnifying glasses, billiard tables, or any other tables or instruments used for gaming, theatricals or other exhibitions, shows and amusements, tippling houses, dram shops, any dealer in wines and liquors by the quantity, or otherwise than as keepers of tippling houses or dram shops; or any gift enterprises, and to suppress prize fighting, dog fights, chicken cock fights, gaming or gambling houses, and to regulate or suppress bawdy or disorderly houses, houses of ill fame or assignation;

Provided, The city or town council shall not grant a license to any tippling house, dram shop or saloon, or permit such houses, shops, or saloons to carry on such business in any ward in the city or any incorporated town, when at the previous election a majority of the votes cast were against license in such wards of the city or incorporated town, or where an order prohibiting the sale or giving away of any vinous, spirituous or intoxicating liquors of any kind, or alcohol, or any compound or preparation thereof commonly called tonic, or bitters, has been made in accordance with the provisions of section 4877.

SEC. 2. All laws and parts of laws in conflict herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed, and this act take effect from and after the 31st day of December, 1897.

ACT XLVI.

AN ACT to prevent combinations of trusts and corporations in the State of Arkansas.

SECTION

1. Prohibits the formation of combinations, trusts, etc.
2. Corporations violating provisions of this act forfeit charters.
3. Punishment fixed for violating this act.
4. Live stock and agricultural products not subject to this act.
5. Persons damaged by trusts to sue same.
