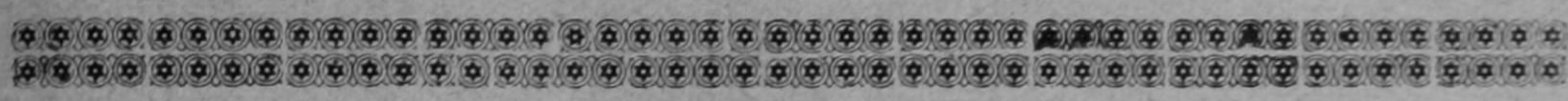

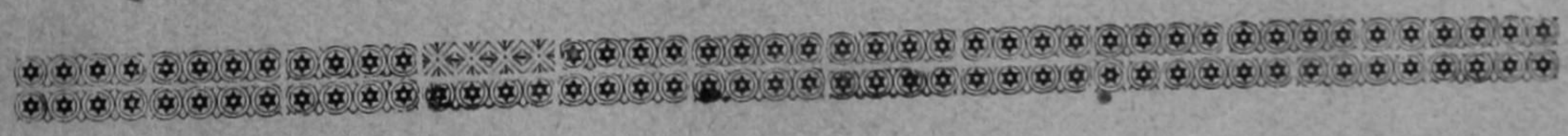

tion where violence is permitted to effect a lawful purpose only that degree of force must be used which is necessary to effect such purpose.

Sec. 9. No verbal provocation justifies an assault and battery but insulting and abusive words may be given in evidence in mitigation of the punishment affixed to the offense.

Sec. 10. The word battery is used in this code in the same sense as assault and battery.

Sec. 11. The punishment for an assault or an assault and battery as herein before defined shall be a fine not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars.

ORDINANCE NO. 5.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE.

Be it ordained by the city council of the city of McKinney:

Sec. 1. That if any person shall go into or near any public place, or into or near any private house and shall use loud and vociferous or obscene, vulgar or indecent language or swear or curse, or yell or shriek or expose his person or rudely display any pistol or other deadly weapon in a manner calculated to disturb the inhabitants of such public place or private house, he shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Sec. 2. A public place within the meaning of Ordinances Nos. 5 and 38 of this code of ordinances is in any public road, street or alley of the City of McKinney or any inn, tavern, store, grocery or workshop or place at which people are assembled or to which people commonly resort for purposes of business, amusement, recreation or other lawful purpose.
